



#### **Message from Ian**

In April the churches of the Benefice will be celebrating Easter. I like Easter, it is a festival that always happens at a nice time of the year. The days are noticeable longer and a bit warmer. Easter is a time to celebrate new life, lambs and calves will be in the fields, The woods are alive with bird song and the family of squirrels that I am still trying to photograph have had a brood of kits. So, we celebrate



this by giving chocolate easter eggs which leave us with a mild chocolate repulsion but are still infinitely better than giving a painted boiled egg.

For Christians there is a sombre aspect of Easter that makes it harder for our non Chrisian friends to buy into. We talk a lot about how an innocent man was betrayed, arrested, went through a mock trial, beaten and then hung out to die in a brutal way. We hold onto to these things not because we are attracted to the 18 rated horror of a brutal murder but because we believe that one unique man, by surrendering his life has made such a huge difference to the lives of billions of people around the world. That is why the cross, which was built as a torture instrument, is held in such high honour by all Christians.

Easter isn't simply about remembering a horror show because the second part of the Easter message is the resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday. If you are not a Christian, the resurrection is a difficult thing to swallow. Dying on a cross in Roman times was easy, hundreds of thousands of people suffered that fate but rising from the dead is a different story.

There are plenty of reasons for Christians to believe that Jesus rose from the dead and we will talk a lot about this in the Easter services.

For me, the compelling reason for the this is the way that the resurrection affects people's lives.

So, can I ask you to reflect as you scoff your second Easter egg of the day that the promise a new start isn't just the world around us but can apply to you as well.







Whether this will be your first time or you have join us many times in the past Come and join us for the return of the Good Friday Walk 18<sup>h</sup> April 2025.



## The North Hampshire District Group countryside charity

CPRE, the Countryside Charity aims to preserve our valued landscapes and countryside for the benefit of residents and visitors alike.

We, at the North Hampshire District Group of CPRE Hampshire, monitor local planning applications to identify development proposals which would be at odds with these aims and be out of keeping with the local landscape character.

One recent example was an application for 28 houses at Cliddesden to which we objected as it proposed a suburban estate type development in the countryside. Our objection was successful in that the application was refused by Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council (BDBC). The applicant appealed the decision, but the appeal was dismissed by the Planning Inspector who agreed that the proposal would have adverse effects on the character of the area and be contrary to Local Plan policies.

The Local Plan is drafted by the Council to guide planning decisions and allocate sites for development. The draft plan then goes through various stages of consultation and examination before finally being adopted.

Currently BDBC's plan is being updated and the first consultation stage completed in March 2024. However, due to the increase in housing numbers mandated by the Government, this consultation will be repeated in Autumn/ Winter 2025. On the current timetable, the plan will be adopted in Winter 2027.

## In the Fields—Emma Ilsley

It finally feels as though we may be turning somewhat of a corner with the weather - early March certainly brought some hard frosts and crisp mornings which we have all longed for and has certainly lifted our spirits as we begin spring drilling.

What does March look like on farm for us?

There are several jobs all happening at once now, meaning that all our fleet are out across the Estate with various implements behind them.

Spring Cambridge Roll: all our cereal crops which were planted in autumn of 2024 will be Cambridge rolled. This process aids with the uniformity of seed emergence by distorting any clods of soil, and presses down any exposed flints into the soil, creating a more even surface in preparation for the combine in the summer – the last thing on our wish list is to be lifting a large flint through the combine!

First application of fertiliser: the winter crops will also all be seeing their first dose of fertiliser through March. In the first week of March, we managed to cover the winter wheat land, putting us in good stead for the remainder of the acreage to be covered.

Spraying a stale seed bed: all land which will be going into spring crops (for example, ex-tillage crop land) has been sprayed off to create a stale seed bed ready for cultivation and drilling. This process is key to ensure that any dormant, or living, weeds and other unwanted green material are killed off, giving young crops the best chance at emergence in the soil without competition from any foreign matter.

Cultivating: all land which will be home to a spring crop will be cultivated in front of the drill. Cultivation will occur around a day in front of the drill, giving the top layer of the soil time to air out. A good breeze and some sunlight are ideal conditions, as this combination will dry the soil in good time.

Drilling: once all the seed bed preparation has taken place, Andy will drill the spring crops into the allocated land. In early March, spring barley drilling will occur – this is always the first crop to be planted. After this, the spring beans will go into the ground in their allocated fields.

I think we can all agree it is a lovely sight to see the tractors working and gives us a positive feeling that 'spring has sprung' and farm life has gone up a gear from its hibernation in winter.







## **Benefice Recipes**

Goodness April already, writing this at the beginning of March we were due some lovely blue sky sunny days. The lawnmower has had a spin round the garden making it look smarter and ready for business. The crocus and snowdrops were lovely and the primroses, daffs and Janeys Whitebells are also making an appearance. Can't wait for the garden to be full of those heady summer scents again.



So, the recipe for April is 'Marry Me Chicken', maybe I should have put this one in the February issue.

#### Serves 4.

#### Ingredients

30g Plain Flour seasoned with salt and pepper

4 Chicken Breasts

125g Sundried tomatoes (drained and roughly chopped, reserve 3tbsp of the oil)

1 Red Onion, 3 Garlic Cloves, crushed or finely grated

A half to 1 tsp Chilli Flakes (to your taste)

2-3 Thyme or Oregano sprigs (leaves picked or 1 tsp mixed dried herbs)

150ml Double cream, 250ml Chicken stock

35g Parmesan grated, 8-10 Basil leaves (torn for serving)

#### Lemon wedges to serve optional

#### Method

Coat the chicken breasts in the seasoned flour. Heat 2 tbsp of the sundried tomato oil in a large, lidded frying pan over a medium heat and fry the chicken for 8-10 minutes till golden all over but not cooked through. Set the chicken aside on a plate.

Drizzle the remaining oil into the pan and reduce the heat to medium-low. Fry the onion for 8-10 minutes until softened but not golden. Stir in the garlic and cook for another minute before adding the tomatoes, chilli and thyme or oregano, stirring well. Add the chicken back to the pan and reduce, then pour over the stock and cream and season well. Put the lid on and cook on medium to low for about 20 minutes, turning the chicken halfway until it is cooked through, and the sauce has thickened a little. Stir in the Parmesan then serve with a scattering of basil leaves and lemon wedges on the side for squeezing over, if you like.

Serve with new potatoes some spring greens and a lovely crusty bread for mopping up. Yummy Enjoy, Tracey

Carrie obtained the rank of Captain during her time with the Royal Signals, and, after the birth of Andrew, her first marriage broke down and she met up again with a long-time friend, Donald, and they married.

In 1982 they moved to Dummer and Carrie soon made friends and threw herself into village life. Within a year she was joining in with Harvest Suppers and made many costumes for them. Donald was serving in the RAMC and Dummer was between Aldershot and Tidworth where Donald was working.

It soon became apparent that Carrie was an excellent needlewoman, and a group of Mums joined together making our children's clothes, even staging a fashion show at one time. Carrie produced multiple items for stalls at fairs and fetes and many of Dummer still have examples of her handiwork. Patchwork became her hobby, and she raised a good sum for many charities.

In 1985 they were posted to Germany and Carrie found herself stuck without her sewing machine and English oblong pillows but with continental square pillowcases. Back from Germany came requests for many objects that were not available in Germany. On their return, Carrie said, in her very dry way "I have enough pillowslips to kit out an army".

In 1990 Donald was sent to Kuwait as an advisor on the possible threat of biological weapons. This was probably the hardest time for Carrie as an Army wife. But although Donald retired in 1996, Lizzie, their daughter, stepped up and Carrie and Donald were very proud of the career she has forged in the army. Although Donald suffered long term dementia, Carrie always said on each of Lizzie's promotions, "Donald would be so proud".

To Andrew and his family and to Lizzie and to Carrie's neighbours who helped her over recent years, we extend our sympathies. She will be missed by us all.
