#### POST-MEETING UPDATE

Thank you so much to everyone who was able to attend our inaugural barn meet on 6th October. It was a fantastic turnout and the glorious sunshine helped to showcase rural Hampshire at its very best. For those who were unable to attend, and as a reminder for those who did, here are the key points:

Chief Inspector Matthew Reeves (District Commander for Basingstoke and Deane) outlined the challenges of policing a borough with such significant and diverse issues in both urban and rural areas, and introduced members of the rural Neighbourhood Policing Team and Countrywatch.

Firearms Licensing Officer Tony Hill gave an update on firearms licensing and emphasised the need to take security seriously to stop guns getting in to the hands of criminals.

Counter Terrorism Security Adviser James Booty spoke about the need to be vigilant and secure fertiliser to help in the fight against terrorism.

Sergeant Stuart Ross from our Countrywatch Team gave a detailed overview of ongoing rural policing operations:

- . Operation Gallileo hare coursing and poaching on land
- Operation Slid Theft of ATVs and guad bikes
- Operation Rebate Other rural thefts and burglaries from outbuildings

We are so pleased that there was such strong support for holding more barn meets in the future and we look forward to meeting you again soon.



practise of rotational cropping shows that a legume monoculture is unlikely to be sustainable.

Bacteria respond to warmer soil temperature and are not that active in cold weather. Grasses will start growing quite early in the year, clovers get going in mid-season. There are so many undiscovered bacteria maybe there is a cold weather Rhizobium yet to be found.


#### **Legumes or Pulses?**

The difference between PULSES and LEGUMES is that LEGUME refers to plants where the seed is enclosed in a pod, while PULSES, a subgroup of legumes, refers to the dried seed. India is the largest producer of pulses at 25% of world production. As we experience some global warming growing pulses like chickpeas, soya, lentils, and lupins should be more successful in the UK, and fields of more exotic legumes and pulses will become common, and our diets will adjust to use the resource. In the meantime field beans, peas and clover will be common crops in UK cropping.

#### **Badgers love Sweet Corn**

I heard recently of the experience of one keen local gardener who this year had grown the best crop of sweetcorn ever, and was looking forward to harvest when she returned from a trip away in September. However, when she got back badgers had taken all the sweet corn and wrecked the patch as if they had been waiting for the right moment to enjoy the fruits of all her labour. This was in the middle of a village so badgers will go far for a treat!!

The soil keeps a bit of heat well into mid-winter, it is in the New Year when frosts can get stronger. A dry soil is colder, so sandy and gravel soils often have a bit more frost. As cold air is denser than warm air it will sink to the bottom of the slopes, creating frost pockets. Where air movement is less, for example in a sheltered corner of a field or a woodland edge, also creates a frost risk.

The autumn crops have established well and with the season staying reasonably dry are growing well, so the crops look good for the end of the year. The fields are sown up as planned, winter tolerant crops are getting the shot of cold to vernalise the seeds and young plants. Winter varieties of oats are a curious exception as they can be sown in the spring and still grow to produce a seed head and grain.

#### Nitrogen fixing crops

After the Nitrogen fertiliser price increases this year I have been having another look at crops that can 'fix' nitrogen (N) as they grow. The group of plants that fix N are Legumes, plants of the pea family, of which there are 19,000 species worldwide, and examples would be peas, soya, beans, and clover. These plants have evolved to have a symbiotic relationship with soil living Rhizobium bacteria that can 'fix' atmospheric N. Other symbiotic bacteria that can do this clever trick are Frankia, and Cyanobacteria. The symbiotic, ie.(mutually beneficial), bacteria tend to live in nodules that grow on the host plant roots. The plant will take some nitrogen for growth and in return supply some nutrients to the bacteria. Plants need nitrogen for protein and nucleic acid production, both essential for growth. There are free living bacteria in soils that can fix N, such as Azobacter species, the nitrogen from them will be picked up by growing plants from the soil solution.

The bacteria filled nodules will supply nitrogen to the growing plant while the plant is alive and release nitrogen as they decay in the following year, so a crop grown after a legume crop will need less additional manufactured or organic N. Think of it as free nitrogen!!

Unfortunately the major crop groups like grains and grasses, maize, potatoes do not have this relationship with N fixing bacteria so cannot fix N. Maybe evolving genetics will one day manage to do this, until then it is unlikely that we would want to live on pulses alone, although some might argue that we should. Good farming

Directed by William Wyler, The billed stars are Myrna Loy, Frederic March, Dana Andrews, Teresa Wright, and Virginia Mao; these actors were all well-known at the time. For me, the true star is a man called Harold Russell, an amateur actor who was a real war veteran who suffered life-changing injuries in a training accident in the war. He won an Oscar for best supporting actor. He does not appear on the poster for the film. He also won an honorary Oscar for "bringing aid and comfort to disabled veterans through the medium of motion pictures." The special award had been created because the board of governors wanted to salute Russell, a non-professional actor, but assumed he had little chance for a competitive win. It was the only time in Oscar history that the academy awarded two Oscars for the same performance.

William Wyler directed over 60 films in a career lasting 45 years, starting in the silent era. His films include The Westerner, Roman Holiday, The Big Country, and Ben Hur.

### Benefice Recipes

Well we're here again, Christmas and New Year comes round so quickly. Although we did have some lovely hot days through summer it still feels like there weren't enough of them. Anyhow, some nice fresh mornings will be welcome and cold clear nights too. The seed catalogues will be poured over, the allotment planner comes out and apart from the sprouts, leeks, cabbages and celeriac, the beds will be tucked up for winter.

All of this accompanied by a hot brew and a slab of fruit cake.

Here are a few little ideas for the up and coming revels, merry making and the boisterous activities that come at this time of year.

#### **Mushroom Pate**

Serves 10-12 as a canapé

#### You need

250g any mushrooms finely chopped, 30g butter, 3-4 garlic cloves finely chopped 250g cream cheese, Salt and pepper

#### Method

Add the butter to a large frying pan then pop the mushrooms and garlic in and sauté on a medium heat, stirring frequently for 10 minutes or until the moisture that the mushrooms release has evaporated.

Leave to cool for a few minutes then blitz in a food processor till smooth. Add cream cheese blitz again untill well blended. Season to taste then leave to cool completely. Refrigerate for at least an hour to allow garlic flavour to develop, will keep for up to a week in fridge.

The smell of these Stilton pastries bubbling in the oven will tempt and tease the taste buds.

#### **Stilton Puffs**

#### You need

1 packet Readymade Puff Pastry (about 375g) up or down scale recipe for weight of pastry you're able to get.

330g/10.5oz Stilton, 1 egg, beaten, 100g/3.5 grated Parmesan

#### Method

Preheat the oven to 200c/400f/gas 6. Line a baking tray with baking parchment. Roll or lay out your pastry to 12 by 9 inches. Cut four strips lengthways and six strips down making 24 rectangles of pastry. Crumble and squish the Stilton in a bowl and then add a teaspoon to each rectangle, brush the edges with egg wash and fold into a parcel and crimp edge closed with a fork and place on your tray. Brush the outside with egg wash and sprinkle over the Parmesan then make a little hole in the top of each with a knife and bake for 10-15 minutes until golden brown all over.

Embrace the Jollities of the season, and may our days be filled with cups of tea and wedges of fruit cake with a slice of cheddar... Yum Tracey


#### DODGEBALL COMPETITION


#### **TAG RUGBY**


