

#### **Dear Friends**

Handel wrote his anthem 'Zadok the Priest and Nathan the Prophet' for the coronation of George II in 1727 and is likely to be heard on Classic Fm playlists this month.

The anthem, sung at Queen Elizabeth II coronation in 1953, refers to the anointing of King Solomon by Nathan the Prophet and Zadok the Priest. King Charles III will be anointed with specially prepared olive oil from the Mount of olives in Jerusalem by the Archbishop of Canterbury in the coronation service.

Anointing with oil is a special action and something a priest or minister may give when prayers for healing are made or applied to a person near to death. A child in the baptism service receives the sign of the cross in oil with the words, "Christ claims you for his own". Church of England clergy in their ordination services are anointed with oil on their hands for service by a Bishop and the oil used in all these occasions will have been blessed in a cathedral service on Maundy Thursday.

The anointing of the monarch draws on the action of Samuel anointing King David, of Zadok anointing Solomon and also the anointing of Bishops, Priests and Deacons in Church of England ordinations. The anointing of the King is a part of the coronation service in which the King's divine role is recognised, that under God he may fulfil that role in which power and service, state and God, authority and accountability all combine in such a way that seeks the best welfare of his subjects. Interestingly the actual anointing of Her late Majesty the Queen was an action too intimate to be televised in 1953, we shall see what happens on May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2023!

Her late Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II was widely praised and respected for her obvious commitment to serve the nation and commonwealth as monarch in a Christ honouring way, she sought wholeheartedly to fulfil her coronation oaths. Some people, we are told, will protest the crowning of King Charles saying, "not my king". (Is that treasonable under the Treason Felony Act 1848?) but we will have a crowned monarch on May 6<sup>th</sup> who will have sworn to serve faithfully under God for the welfare of all. Let us support him and our nation in making this prayer to God, from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer

With Hedgehog numbers in decline and Hedgehog awareness on the rise, there has never been a better time to get involved in Hedgehog conservation.

A Hedgehog Highway is a 5-inch gap in a fence and is essential in the battle to prevent the extinction of our endangered spiky friends. This gap allows them access to forage for food and meet mates.

Hedgehog shaped fence surrounds raise awareness to the plight of Hedgehogs, create a talking point and encourage others to take part in the project. Fence surrounds are made from recycled plastic and can themselves be recycled.

I am asking for each area of the UK to use a small portion of their assigned funds to purchase a box of hedgehog highway surrounds and make them available for their residents.

Each box of 50 is £150 and includes:

- 50 Hedgehog Highway surrounds & 50 information leaflets
- A display box & window sticker showing you are part of the project.
- Ideas about ways to benefit your community include:
  - Donate the Highways and leaflets to your local school to educate in wildlife conservation
- ♦ Swap the Highways for a donation of Hedgehog food which can then be given to your local Hedgehog Rescue Centre

The project will be receiving a lot of publicity in the coming months via social media, and I really hope that you choose to take part.

My dream is to make the whole of the UK one giant Hedgehog Highway and for that dream to come true, it needs **everyone** to take part.



#### **Benefice Recipes**

As I write this it's almost Easter. Hopefully it will be a lovely sunny warm weekend, the potatoes can be planted along with the onions and shallots that are raring to go in the cold frame. Then it's time to tuck the beds up like Fort (Knox to keeping the darn wildlife out. We also have some asparagus after two years of waiting which we can now cut, looking forward to that.



The recipe this month is for a Rhubarb Chutney, although a crumble never loses its appeal it might be nice to have something that lasts a little longer.

#### **Rhubarb Chutney**

Makes about two kilograms or four and a half pounds, around 5 jars.

#### You will need:

1 kg Rhubarb

675g light brown muscovado sugar, 2 medium onions chopped 500 ml white wine or cider vinegar, 2 tbsp whole grain mustard 1 tsp ground mixed spice, 1 tsp ground ginger, 1 tsp ground black pepper 1 tsp sea salt, A quarter tsp cayenne pepper.

Trim the rhubarb and cut into short lengths and place all the ingredients in a preserving pan or large saucepan with a heavy bottom.

Cook over a low heat stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Bring to a gentle boil (just a little more than simmering) and cook uncovered for about one hour (depending on your pan it may be more or less than an hour). Cook till golden brown and thick.

Stir occasionally to begin with and then more frequently as the cooking time goes on to prevent the mixture from burning on the base of the pan.

This is the pot that you should actually watch. Spoon into hot sterilised jars. Cover and seal. Great with some lovely cheese and bread.

As a side note I managed to steer clear of puddings and chocolate for Lent. I have come to the conclusion that chocolate and puddings will never leave my life again, so next year it's cheese. I reckon I can manage that after a seasonal blow out.



#### **Rediscovering Chalk Stream Treasures**

Formed by a happy accident of weather and geology, our chalk streams show nature at its most magnificent. But look into the water near an old house, footpath, or footbridge and you may also see human additions: fragments of blue-and-white Victorian pottery, the edge of a stoneware beer bottle, or a shard of aqua glass from the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Jane Eastman, who lives near the Upper Test, is dedicated to rediscovering these lost treasures. For several years now, she has been 'streamlarking' – wading in chalk streams and plucking pieces of history from their gravelly beds. The result is an incredible range of finds, each made more fascinating when her research reveals their origins.

There are coffin-shaped poison bottles, sometimes with contents remaining. There are the bowls of broken clay pipes – the cigarette butts of their day. There are imperfectly made ink bottles – testaments to a time of rapidly increasing literacy. Then there are precious metals: an 18-carat gold wristwatch and a folding fruit knife in sterling silver.

After some careful cleaning, Jane posts her finds on a dedicated Instagram account called @myordinarytreasure, along with their stories. This act of sharing has given thousands of people a window into Hampshire's history, and highlighted how our chalk streams have shaped – and been shaped by – human lives over the centuries.

But for Jane, the search itself has equal value. "It's a privilege to enjoy the local landscape from this unique perspective; to be immersed in a river that's thriving and teeming with life," she says. "Without a doubt, it is this experience of being in the beautiful chalk stream environment which I take home as the ultimate 'treasure'."

If you'd like to have a go at streamlarking, remember to get permission from the landowner when on private land. Stick to shallow water and don't go out alone; chalk streams can be deeper and faster than they look. Always use the 'Check, Clean, Dry' process for your clothes and equipment, to avoid spreading diseases and invasive species.

#### IN THE FIELDS By Seumas Foster

Everything is a Blur, and it's not Just the Rain on the Windows

Everything moves so fast at this time of year it really can be a case of 'blink and you miss it'. Accelerated by sunshine and rain the buds burst open, leaves expand and the gaps between the twigs on the trees disappear. Grass grows and seed heads start to show, flowers appear, each having a place and time they have adapted to fill.

You will have noticed how quickly the crops have grown this spring; the first seed heads of the Winter Barley crops should be showing awns on the ears at the top of the crop by the end of May. Oil Seed rape will have flowered in April, fields of yellow flowers, which, with any luck, are dazzling in the spring sunshine.

#### Wet March

Reports of the rainfall in March told us it was the wettest in forty years. My rain gauge collected 168mm, last year was 60mm and the recent average seems to be around 65-70mm. In 1981 I can remember we had a very wet February and March, that was a year we started to use low ground pressure vehicles, the ArgoCat, to spread fertiliser and do some spraying. This was an eight-wheel, balloon tyred vehicle developed for wet conditions and difficult terrain, and they are still used on the hills and moors in Scotland, and probably many other places, for work where low ground pressure is needed.

It was quite exciting bouncing across fields that were completely impassable for ordinary tractors. They would have sunk without trace, leaving huge ruts and soil everywhere. In those days most fields were ploughed and once saturated became very soft. That was the year that a mallard reared her ducklings on a flooded wheel rut in a field overlooking Basingstoke.

#### **Arable 'Weeds' Are Endangered.**

Ever since the first crops were grown, some plants have adapted to survive and thrive in a cultivated environment, and these plants are what a farmer would call 'arable weeds'. Light, chalky, less fertile soils are perfect for them. They have great names such as Prickly Poppy, Pheasant Eye, Shepherds Needle, Cudweed, Corn Cockle and Corn Salad. These 'weeds' have characteristics that give them an advantage over other 'weeds', such as being quick growing, competitive and seeds that ripen before harvest. They are all annual plants and flourish when soils are cultivated, so the change to minimum tillage does not help them, and because of this they are becoming quite rare, classed now as 'endangered species'. The use of herbicides and fertiliser will have started the decline of these plants. Some of the options in the new ELM (Environmental Land Management Scheme) and existing Stewardship schemes have options to encourage annual cultivation of field margins so these 'weeds' can survive and thrive, and more people need to take up these options. The rush to plant grass margins is not helping these very beautiful 'weeds'.
