



"Are you blessed?" Sermon

Dear Friends

One hymn that is always popular is 'Guide me o thou great redeemer, pilgrim through this barren land'.

I suspect the rousing tune that allows singers to 'belt it out' is one reason for its popularity, who doesn't like to get behind a strong song and sing it out!

Our churches have a regular stream of visitors who are walking a section of a pilgrimage route on the Camino de Santiago or Way of St James, who is believed to be buried there. UK pilgrims walk from Reading Abbey to Southampton for the UK section of this pilgrimage and some stop there, but others do the whole route of around 750km.

In Mediaeval times a pilgrimage was seen as penitential and completing one, barefoot even, would relieve one from punishment of 'temporal' sins. The Reformation was the corrective to those erroneous ideas with Luther's work in the 1500s bringing the church back to understanding the complete work of Christ on the cross as making full pardon for sin, received by faith and not by 'works' eg. walking a road barefoot, excessive fasting and self-flagellation.

But I do wonder if the line about being a pilgrim gives the hymn some appeal. We are familiar with the idea that life is a journey with multiple destinations or stages in life all taking us toward the final destination to 'cross the Jordan'. Crossing the river Jordan in the bible was the occasion when the people of Israel left their forty years of wilderness wanderings to enter the 'promised land'. So, when we die, we leave behind this life with all its blessings and vicissitudes in hope of heaven. Or not? Some people undertake a pilgrimage as a purposeful journey to experience moving from place to place with a focus on their walk of faith with Christ, not to gain merit with God but rather to have a focused contemplative experience accompanying physical

To travel through life with faith in Jesus Christ is a wonderful thing, to know his peace and presence now and be ready to 'cross the Jordan' when the time comes knowing where we are going and whom we shall meet is truly a blessing.

Common Mission Fund

There is a big ask each year to all our parishes that they contribute to our 'Common Mission Fund' which is essentially a figure set by Winchester Diocese so that if all our parishes paid their portion the books would balance at Diocesan HQ!! The annual budget is based on what money is essential to meet various fixed costs, ministers, housing, office costs, etc and then seeing if that sum can be raised across all the parishes in Winchester Diocese. There is a formula that considers the size of congregations as well as their perceived affluence. There is a little more finesse than that, but the idea is to base an "ask" on some knowledge of how realistic a payment from different parishes across an area (roughly) from Southampton to Muddeford, to Stockbridge to Hook to Winchester, might be. Built into that model is a 'weighted ask' so those who might have more affluence than others are able to assist the less able to pay parishes.

Saint Paul wrote to the church in Corinth (2 Cor 9) commending the generosity of those who contributed to a church collection to relieve the needs of other Christians elsewhere. He commended those who gave, not from compulsion, but rather with eyes wide open generous hearted giving away of their own funds to assist churches in another place. He commended their zeal in giving to others and wrote, using imagery of an agrarian culture, "whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. So, let each one give as s/he purposes in their heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver"

So, this is a short piece to say that the recurring request to our churches for funds is again made to us, details of which I can provide, and my thanks to all who do give, both from inside the church and those not quite at the centre of church life! We are unlikely to meet our current 'ask' this year in all our parishes, and so if anyone reading this would like to add support, please do get in touch with any of our church treasurers, wardens, or me. The most effective way of giving is via the Parish Giving Scheme that will automatically get gifts to the right account with the enhancement of 25% thanks to 'Gift Aid', courtesy of the Chancelor of the Exchequer.

Jam, jelly, crumble, or my personal favourite, Blackberry Wine □.

Random facts about Blackberries:

Blackberries are not botanically classed as 'berries' they are in fact an 'aggregate fruit' composed of 'drupelets'

Himalayan Blackberry is classed as a noxious weed, and an invasive species in Canada and North America.

The term 'bramble' refers to any impenetrable thicket, while a 'briar or brier' can be used to describe the dense vines, it can also be used to describe other thorny thickets.

Folklore in the United Kingdom and Ireland tells that blackberries should not be picked after Old Michaelmas Day (11 October) as the devil (or a Púca) has made them unfit to eat by stepping, spitting or fouling on them.

It does mean that Autumn is on its way, and with it all the glorious colours of bronze, gold and brown as the leaves die and fall.

If you are building bonfires watch out for hedgehogs.



The lessons of DD have been taken and adapted over the last 40 years, cultivations have been reduced and improved with less soil disturbance and compaction, timings have improved, mostly courtesy of the machinery manufacturers supported by developments of crop protection. The type of crops grown has changed, more profitable winter crops taking increased acreage at the same time

The new approach of 'Regen Farming' taking in all the new information, science, economic benefits, is being talked about everywhere now, and in the last few years has really built up a momentum. Sustainability has taken the stage — middle and front. Soil Health is being given the attention it deserves, and the way soils behave when they are cultivated is perhaps now better understood, so are the relationships of soils with soil flora and fauna and the crops being grown, which bring their own benefits.

This is taking new knowledge and understanding and applying it where it can benefit, which is just how it should be. There is still a place for ploughs, they are after all, the 're-set button' for crop establishment, to be used when all else fails.



IN THE FIELDS By Seumas Foster

Time for Change.

Harvest finished, sowing new crops, shorter days, cultivating, dew wet morning grass, seeds, mud, hedge cutting. Autumn has started and is as busy as usual.

August rainfall was about nearly three times the average, but we had a wetter August as recently as 2020. The saving grace is that moisture at this time is quickly gone, at least on the surface as the air is warm and dry, so everything soon dries. As soon as September starts, (the official meteorological start to autumn), rainfall hangs about a bit longer and drying times get increasingly longer until they eventually seem to merge with the next wet spell.

This year we had an extremely warm spell at the beginning of September, and I don't think anyone complained, except maybe for people returning to school, who had good cause!

Crop Establishment

40 to 50 years ago there was a lot of interest in a technique of crop establishment called 'Direct Drilling', which was exactly as it described, that is sowing seeds directly into soils without cultivations beforehand, so the soil was left undisturbed between crops. New machines were developed which cut a slot in the soil with a disc, the seed was dropped into the slot and then the slot was closed by a following press wheel. Previously the plough was the principal tool for cultivation and had been for thousands of years. Direct Drilling, (DD), worked well in some fields with some crops but not all, in some parts of fields but not all, and brought bits own challenges to cope with which became apparent over a few years. DD was possible with development of a machine strong enough to cope with uncultivated soil, and herbicides that could be used to clean fields of weeds before sowing. Glyphosate as Roundup was towards the end of the 1970's was the most important change.

DD was used for a few years but the shift in weed patterns, soil compaction and the expense of machines maintenance, and slower work rates caused a rethink, and the general approach began to look at mixing establishment techniques, a pragmatic approach which was more reliable. The major contribution of DD was probably to bring the emphasis on soil structure, behaviour, health and better ways to look after what is after all 'the farmers basic asset'.

Benefice Recipes

Well, the children are back to school and college and our youngest has had to go from night owl to early bird again. I hope the beautiful sunshine at the beginning of September was welcomed, it certainly was here. Our trip out to the Alresford Show this year was lovely though very hot. We paid a visit to the the Garlic Farm stand for their lovely mayo's, pickle, and horseradish. Then off to the Meon Valley Bee-



keepers marquee for a taste of different types of honey and picking a few jars as a birthday present to me. Archie and Adam entered the tractor for the first time and Archie drove it in the main ring for the Vintage machinery parade, his cousin Isabella squeezed in beside him. We came home with a sixth-place rosette, completely unexpected but which we were all thrilled with. So the recipe this month is one for figs which I must say I'm not a fan of. They look so beautiful; I really want to love them, and this could be the gentle introduction I need.

Melting Fig Filo Parcels Pre heat oven to 200c gas 6

4 Sheets of Filo Pastry. Halved lengthways into long strips, 200g Brie or Taleggio or Stilton (diced)

6 Figs diced, 2 teaspoons of fresh lemon thyme leaves, 50 g unsalted melted butter.

Method

Pre heat oven.

Stack the 8 pastry strips on top of each other and cover with a damp tea towel. Remove the top pastry strip, leaving the others covered, and lay vertically on a sheet of baking parchment. Place a few pieces of cheese and fig at the top of the strip, scatter over some thyme and season.

From one of the top corners, fold over diagonally to enclose the filling, and continue folding down the vertical strip to form a neat triangular parcel. You should end up with a samosa shape. Brush all over with the melted butter and place on a baking tray lined with parchment. Repeat the process to make 8 parcels. Bake the parcels for 10 to 15 minutes until crisp and golden, serve warm.

I think if I add a drizzle of honey I could be tempted.


Our next Sunday Special will be on Sunday 1st October at 11:15.


