



The scaffolding has been removed from most of the church roof and there is just a small amount of work to be done on the tower.


We expect to have services again in February but prior to that we will need help from the parishioners of Brown and Chilton Candover to clean the church.

Graves in Churchyard of St John the Evangelist, Northington

The Northington PCC intends to apply for a faculty in May 2021 for permission from the Diocesan Chancellor to remove the kerbstones and other grave furniture, to leave just the headstone on all full bodied graves in the churchyard and return the ground to level grass so the graves can be mown and kept weed free and tidy and in conformity with the Churchyard Regulations of the Diocese. We hope that all will understand this need but if there are any objections, please contact the PCC Secretary c/o Ruffside, Northington, SO24 9TH by 30 April 2021.

If any grave is unsafe and/or untended we will ask the relatives to repair the memorial in order to pass the safety standards of the Diocesan architect within 8 months and to tend the grave to ensure it remains tidy.

The application for a Faculty will be made in May 2021 and work commenced once the Faculty is granted. The work may well take over 2 years and so the Faculty application will ask for the Faculty to run for that period. Any grave that receives an objection to being simplified will be temporarily spared but failure to repair a monument and/or tend a grave by 30 Apr 2022 will be taken by the PCC as a withdrawal of the objection.

The removed furniture will be used in the foundations for the repair and refurbishment of the Grade 2 Listed Churchyard walls





The Covid-19 Local Engagement Board is headed up by the Leader of the County Council. It is advised by the Director of Public Health (DoPH), Simon Bryant. I attend the meetings as your Councillor and as Cabinet Member for Wellbeing at WCC. The local virus figures are low but rising steadily, so many events are being cancelled by organisers or by the DoPH. We want Christmas to be good for everyone- and I'm sure you'll agree that a Covid-free Christmas present is the best present we can imagine right now. Meanwhile, click on the interactive map on www.jackieporter.co.uk for recent, very local Covid-19 data.

If you have an autistic person in your family, you'll know the challenges of obtaining a diagnosis. At HCC **Children's Scrutiny we heard of the woeful progress of services for Autistic children** which has been an ongoing problem for more years than I can remember. It's a money issue- there just isn't enough- and the funding needed didn't happen because the General Election of 2019 'got in the way'. To an 'old hand' like me, this felt like Groundhog Day. I have asked for frequent updates until this is resolved, and was pleased that the NHS Director, newly appointed to carry this forward, agreed: this *must* improve.

Hampshire Hospital options: Online consultations involving 1000 people were held through the summer. Most people who attended the online events wanted the best healthcare wherever it was possible, the opportunity to 'stay local' for tests and checkups, excellent public transport links to all sites (including Alton and Andover) for staff, patients and visitors, and a better link between the NHS and social care .

Options for care have been drawn up by HHFT. You will be able to comment on these in early 2021. Visit www.hampshiretogether.nhs.uk for more information about this health service improvement programme – and you can also follow it on Facebook (www.facebook.com/hampshiretogether).

Please give your comments: even if you haven't been to any of our hospitals yet, it is worth putting yourself in the shoes of an employee, patient or visitor to think how it would work for you.



Tax break for homeworkers

If you have been working from home at any time since March because of the coronavirus pandemic, you probably would have run up higher household bills.

The good news is that HMRC is able to make a small contribution in the form of a tax break towards expenses such as

for electricity and heating.

To be eligible, you must be carrying out duties of your employment under homeworking arrangements. This means that you are regularly performing some or all of your duties at home.

Where, as is often the case, it is not possible to calculate the extra costs, then a claim for £26 per month (£18 per month prior to 6 April 2020) for monthly paid employees or £6 a week (£4 per week prior to 6 April 2020) can be made without having to justify the figure. This amount will not cover the cost of business calls, for which an additional claim can be made based on actual costs.

You cannot claim for any expenses that you would normally have to pay such as mortgage interest or rent, council tax, ordinary water rates and insurance.

Where your employer contributes towards homeworking expenses then you can only claim for the portion which has not already been covered by your employer. HMRC has set up a dedicated online microservice which can be found by visiting www.gov.uk/tax-relief-for-employees/working-at-home that will automatically apply the whole 2020/21 tax year's relief via your tax code.

In fact, you can actually use it to claim just before this tax year too as the lockdown started on 23 March 2020 – you just need to put that date in. You should be able to get a refund for the whole of this tax year, which started 6 April 2020 and two weeks extra on top.

Walking with Wildlife

How many holly berries does a redwing gobble up for breakfast? I'm trying to count as a small flock of redwings raids a nearby holly tree at first light. Berry after berry disappears, each plucked and swallowed whole. It's an early winter buffet and the scarlet berries are still rather hard and bitter. According to the charity Plantlife, the berries need to be softened first by frosts to be made more palatable and less toxic. The redwings though seem unconcerned, returning day after day to forage, slowly but steadily stripping the tree of berries before moving on to the next holly.

In clear light I have a better view of these Nordic wintering thrushes, nine of them, as they dive down one at a time to flutter and bounce around the sprays of holly while snapping up berries. Their bold white eye-stripe is distinctive, together with their speckled chests and the russet glow of their flanks and under-wings. They may seem totally absorbed in their feast but remain remarkably wary, presumably hawk alert, flying off in all directions in a scatter pattern of alarm at the slightest hint of disturbance.

Perching far up in the bare canopy of surrounding birch trees, they watch and wait for the all-clear

In the misty half-light of a brisk wintry walk, with little sign of life, flocks of redwings are often seen, usually in outline, as they break cover from a hedgerow where they've been feeding on berries and haws.

Their larger cousins, fieldfares, also roam the downlands in shadowy flocks like a band of warriors, suddenly appearing in the tree-tops, grey-heads held high as they scout for berries. The distinctive chak-chak chatter and chuckle of fieldfares busily harvesting the blood-red haw-berries of a wayside hedge, is one of the sounds and sights of the early winter.

I'm so focussed on the antics of thrushes and continental blackbirds tucked away in the local hedge-banks, that I'm quite startled by the tremendous woof-wump of wing-beats as a passing flock of woodpigeons plunges low overhead

Dear residents

First may I wish you all a very happy New Year and hope you all had a good Christmas period. As in previous years I will provide an update of parish crime for the communities covered by this magazine in the February edition.

Whilst I am pleased to report no reported crime of note in the area of this magazine, I am appealing for any information in relation to the following crimes not too far away. Overnight of November 29 and 30 fields that are directly south of the M3 were driven over and substantial damage was caused to the growing crops. The padlocks were broken on gates that lead into these fields from both the Woods Lane and at the other end at Garlic Lane entrances. We suspect that this damage was caused by poachers looking to chase and kill hares and deer. Sadly this was an exact mirror of the same damage being caused in the same area overnight of November 13 and 14.

Poachers were also very active overnight of November 28 and 29 when substantial damage was caused to fields at Moundsmere, I am aware that similar damage was caused to a field in Green Lane, Ellisfield that same night. Between November 28 and 30 similar damage as a result of poaching was also reported at Dummer Grange.

On Thursday December 10 2020 at 8:15 PM three men were disturbed at a farm on Weston Road, Herriard trying to break into a farm workshop. After being disturbed they went up Weston Road to Herriard crossroads then over into Bagmore Lane and stole a Daihatsu Fourtrak 4x4 vehicle registration S627VKE. This was pulling a trailer which had a quad bike on it. The trailer was found the following morning whilst the vehicle and quad bike have not been seen since.

I am appealing for any information in relation to a nasty incident in which two 10 month old sheep lambs were killed by a dog(s). This happened on Thursday November 26 in a field next to the by-way on Oakhill Lane Preston Candover. Sadly both lambs died of bite wounds. I am aware that the dog ran through an electric fence in order to get at the sheep. I cannot reiterate enough that this is a very serious matter and I urge all dog owners to please make sure their dogs are under proper control and on leads near livestock. Please be aware that farmers have authority to shoot any dog found worrying livestock on agricultural land. 

High pressure brought fine weather and unbroken sunshine but cooler temperatures from 4^{th} - 6^{th} . The first air frost of the season and coldest night was recorded on the 4^{th} . The predominant southerly and south-westerly winds resulted in mild weather with wet and windy spells between the 9^{th} and 25^{th} . The last five days were dry but overcast with the coldest day at $46^{\circ}F$ on the 26^{th} . Overall, the month was mild with below average rainfall. The temperature for the autumn was average and, due to the exceptionally wet October,

On the Farm—Ben Robinson

The winter routine is in full swing. Moving sheep around the grazing as well as bedding and feeding cattle are currently frequent jobs at the moment.

Grazing sheep in different fields invariably involves spending time erecting and dismantling electric fencing at this time of year. This can be done fairly quickly with our home made reel winder that sits on the front of the farm buggy. The five year plan involves a lot more permanent fencing which should make moving livestock around the farm much more efficient.

Currently I have some ewes on grass, other ewes on barley stubble re-growths and the very last of the lambs on stubble turnips. The lambs have done well this year. Prices have been at historic highs for a number of interesting reasons. Firstly although pubs and restaurants have been closed intermittently throughout the year the takeaways have remained open. Vast amounts of lamb and mutton are sold through curry houses so these have driven demand. Secondly as people have been spending more time at home they have been more willing to cook from scratch, this suits lamb dishes. Thirdly for the first time in many years there has been a resurgence in younger consumers choosing lamb. Finally there is a shortage of sheep meat globally, which has supported the export trade.

What happens after 1st January is currently unknown!

I am awaiting the arrival of a Mill & Mix machine to produce a homemade feed for the cattle. This belongs to a Dorset based feed company who travel from farm to farm creating livestock rations. I provide the barley from our own crop and their machine grinds it and blends in minerals, molasses and protein pellets to produce a full ration to be fed to the cattle. This is in addition to the baled silage they also receive. In theory it should work out cheaper than buying in standard feed from a feed company. I will review in 6 months to see whether the difference in price is worth the time and hassle factor.

Happy New Year! And surely it has to be, better than 2020, right?

For more than a decade I have represented us in Parliament and I have never worked harder but, also, never found it more rewarding.

It is true, in any walk of life, that experience aids success but I feel blessed to have so much I can fall back on for the benefit of the people I represent.

The early part of this year will (hopefully) be recovery from the pandemic; both in how we **roll out the vaccine** across Hampshire and seek to get economic growth going again.

I am being very regularly briefed by Dr Nigel Watson, who is leading the county wide vaccine programme for the NHS, and it's a humbling effort — with so many people involved. My message is simple, no-one is safe until everyone is safe so I shall be rolling up my sleeves the moment I am asked to have the jab and I would beg you to do likewise. We don't have time for dangerous conspiracy theories (or politics), we just need to get vaccinated.

I have worked closely with the regulator (the MHRA) and constituents can be confident they will interrogate the data robustly before granting any licenses.

And on the subject of a virus which has ended too many lives too early, I was so proud to be part of England's **first ever HIV Commission** which has made recommendations to meet the Government's pledge to end new HIV cases by 2030.

I set-up the group while Public Health Minister and subsequently worked to produce its' report after leaving Government last year. And I used a special debate in the House of Commons, timed to coincide with the Commission's launch on World Aids Day, to call on Ministers to accept its recommendations in full. Other work I have been doing lately, and in the year ahead, will focus on **nurseries** and early years, **cancer**, local **transport** - and the recovery of our **creative industries** via my place on the powerful DCMS Select Committee.

And finally, plans are afoot for the eventual disposal of **Sir John Moore Barracks** when the MOD depart and you may have already seen something of them. In short, it's a mixed use plan comprising around 1000 houses (too many), a commercial element (too little), park and ride (why?), sports pitches (great) and a supported living facility. My message has consistently been – do not over-develop this site – and I have introduced the team to the Dever Society because whatever happens will impact on the wider area including the Itchen Valley.
