

Dear Friends

Learning about our ancestors can be a fascinating thing to do and TV programs like, "Who do you think you are?" take viewers through research revealing details of a person's relatives; who they were, where they lived, their occupations and all kinds of interesting facts along the way.

In the summer I was given a box of old black and white photos, one striking photo showed a man named James Chattell staring directly into the camera from his cell in Dartmoor prison. My grandfather, who died when I was three, was imprisoned for his conscientious refusal to bear arms since, as a devout member of the Plymouth Brethren, he believed it was wrong to take a life.

I stared at a young man's face, the familial likeness staring back at me. Here was a man I never knew, a forebear whose life had, in part, shaped mine through some of his familial and business decisions in life.

How many forks in the road, how many free important decisions, and those of time and chance, were taken by our ancestors to arrive at where we are to-day? We'll never know many of them, although we can track some of the significant ones of matrimony, location and occupation.

Entering Christian faith is to enter into the history of our spiritual ancestors. Abraham is called the 'Father of faith', as he was given promises from God that he trusted God to keep and so was blessed and called 'righteous'. That important principle of believing what God says is how we are blessed by God today in Jesus Christ.

In the Baptism Service we touch on the story of the Israelite slaves in Egypt and how, by the powerful action of God, they were saved as they fled Egypt through the waters of the Red Sea into freedom. This speaks of how God rescues those who are trapped with no hope from the slavery of sin, from the oppression of darkness in our lives to a place in which we know God's love, mercy, compassion and forgiveness.

Also in baptism, the historical events of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus become our story too when we identify with Jesus' death in dying to our sin and wonderfully joined with him in his resurrected life. We then experience new life, given by God's Holy Spirit, that, as Jesus was given new life by God, so we are joined by faith to him to have new spiritual life.

I wonder what your spiritual story might be. Did it begin in baptism when godparents made promises about trusting in Jesus on your behalf? Perhaps the only reminder of that event is an old photo which seems like a distant entry on the first page of a book with hundreds more pages and chapters since





Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

Drawing back the curtains early one foggy morning, I spot a busy little bird foraging for insects within the hazel canopy just beyond my study window. I note its autumn coat of olive-brown with dark leggings and a dip-twitch tail.

It's a chiffchaff: a leaf warbler often heard chanting its springtime chiff-chaff call from high in a copse or hedgerow. Now resident all year, this active insect feeder switches to fruit and berries during the winter months.

The back field is shrouded in mist, the far oaks and ash trees just dim silhouettes, as I set off for my walk, tiptoeing through a spidery world of dew-damp webs and threads, revealed in all their fog-dripped patterns. In the low light, a clod of earth shifts into pheasant form, before racing away into the gloom, head held high. Beside the path, the deep green leafy wall of the hedgebank is tied with a twine of crimson berries, bryony beads, linking back to a holly also agleam with scarlet berries. Reaching the copse, formerly a game covert, I watch as a family of three roe deer set off across a stubble field. Part trotting, part pronking – a four-legged leap upwards – their white rump patches bounce away into the shadows.

The Michaelmas migration of swallows and house martins seemed quite discreet this year: no mass gatherings of twittering flocks along the power lines or in the tree-tops. Just a steady flow of small groups well spaced out, passing overhead. Feeding parties were hedgehopping on sunny mornings or skimming the fields for a final stopover on their long journey south.

Along the hedgerows, the leaves of elder seem the first this year to turn russet, while ivy-clad tree trunks are a mass of pompoms. These globular clusters of yellow-green flowers are a late source of nectar and pollen for bees, especially the ivy bees, and red admiral butterflies.

The seasonal change is further heralded by the robin's wistful twilight song. On calm starry nights the tawny owls also begin their territorial hooting contests – calling by owl-light.



On the Farm—Ben Robinson

The past week has seen a lovely spell of dry, sunny weather. You may have seen lots of tractors out cultivating, drilling wheat and barley as well as maize harvesting. To cultivate and drill successfully the ground needs to be dry enough to travel on without making a mess, the machinery becoming stuck or the ground 'smearing'. However, there also needs to be a bit of moisture under the surface so the newly planted seed can make a quick start and start growing. The heavy clay soils in the area have a much tighter window in which you can cultivate and plant than the more forgiving lighter, chalkier ground.

The spell of mild sunny weather has also been beneficial for the vines. The grapes are just beginning to be picked, a few weeks later than normal. It has not been a vintage Summer, with many cool, cloudy days, which adversely affect the sugar content or Brix level of the grapes. In our marginal climate for vineyards a sufficient Brix level is crucial to be able to make quality wine.

Sky high gas prices have been in the news a great deal recently. The price of natural gas has risen to such an extent that the UK's only fertiliser plants have ceased production. The production of fertiliser uses natural gas and produces enormous quantities of carbon dioxide, which is then used to keep packaged vegetables fresh and to stun pigs before slaughter. There is now a potential for a serious lack of fertiliser when it is needed in the Spring. Fertiliser prices have already more than doubled and are still rising. It is highly likely that the use of less fertiliser on crops next Spring and Summer will mean lower yields. To an extent this is a global problem and is already leading to higher food prices - how high will they go is anyone's guess.

In a volatile world national food and energy security is looking increasingly important. It seems rather ironic that as the world leaders meet at the COP summit in Glasgow to look for ways to reduce CO_2 emissions, one of the most pressing issues in the UK at the moment...has been caused by insufficient CO_2 emissions!




It really was a wonderfully entertaining talk and great to hear the hall ringing with laughter again.
