



Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

Under seemingly endless days of blue skies and bright sunshine, springtime in the Candovers has been a gentle delight this year. Birdsong, butterflies, bluebell woods and blossom humming with bees, help to set the scene.

As the woods and hedgerows leaf up, grassy verges turn white with cow parsley, while the hawthorns now hold centre stage smothered in their May blossom. Along the valley, stately horse chestnuts reveal themselves with tapered spires of floral candles.

Although the wintering thrushes have largely departed, the return of the summer visitors is keenly anticipated. During the Easter holidays a pair of swallows dramatically appeared early one evening, lit up by the setting sun as they swept along the treeline near our home. Looping and swooping with effortless grace (to paraphrase Mark Cocker in Birds Britannica), they were clearly feeding, snapping up insects on the wing. A small bat, a pipistrelle, newly emerged from hibernation, whizzed into view, also in hot pursuit of an early meal.

Heading up to the Abbotstone Down reserve one sunny morning, we found the chalk grassland well cropped revealing the bumps and bobbles of anthills. There was a curious mauve patch where the winter work parties had cut and cleared the hazel coppice, just below the bank of the Iron Age settlement. Here was an intriguing mix of spring flowers: the sky-blues of field speedwell, tangled with the violet shades of ground ivy, flowing around the purplish pagodas of bugle, all basking in the morning sunlight.

In the background, birdsong, wonderful birdsong. This was not a thrush or robin but a virtuoso, a warbler of distinction. But which one? Whoever was singing was well hidden, tucked away in the leafy thickets beyond. An old adage advises that if the shadowy form of the bird is visible it may be a blackcap; if not, it's a garden warbler. Fortunately, these days with reference to the Merlin Bird ID app, we were able to confirm it was indeed a garden warbler – an odd name though for a little bird that rarely visits gardens.







Inhalers for Asthma & COPD

Inhalers for Asthma and COPD have been around for several decades and are excellent treatments for these conditions. The production of metered dose inhalers (MDI) uses up vast amounts of energy and leads to increased green house gas production and have a carbon footprint of 28kg per inhaler. That's the same carbon footprint as the tailpipe greenhouse gas emissions of driving 175miles (or from London to Sheffield) in a small car. Most inhalers we use are MDIs.

There is however an alternative in the form of dry powder inhalers (DPI) which can be produced at a fraction of the cost of a MDI. It is our aim to gradually switch as many people as possible from MDI to DPI. Fortunately we have an excellent range of inhalers available to do this.

Please do ask our asthma nurses when you have your asthma review whether you can be changed over to a more environmentally friendly inhaler. You can read more here: <http://greeninhaler.org/>

However not everyone will be able to use DPIs. For the very young and people without a strong suck we will continue with MDIs. They are of course best used with a chamber.

Be tick aware!

Watch out there are ticks about! It's the perfect conditions for these mini beasts.

Here's a helpful reminder of some simple 'tick tips' if you're out walking.

These tiny insects, which can transmit bacteria such as Lyme disease, can be found throughout the year but are most active between spring and autumn. They are typically found in woodland, grassland, moorland or heathland but are also found in urban parks and gardens. When out walking, remember to keep to footpaths, avoiding long grass
'Tick tips' for walkers include:

- ✓ Wear appropriate clothing (a long-sleeve shirt and trousers tucked into your socks);
- ✓ Use an insect repellent;
- ✓ Wear light coloured fabrics that may help you spot a tick on your clothes;
- ✓ Inspect your skin for ticks, particularly at the end of the day, including your head, neck and skin folds (armpits, groin and waistband)
- ✓ Check your children's head and neck areas, including their scalp (skin on top of their head)
- ✓ Check that pets do not bring ticks into your home in their fur.

If you do get bitten by a tick, removing it quickly and correctly can help to reduce any potential risk. The only safe way to remove a tick is to use a pair of fine-tipped tweezers, or an easy-to-use device which can be purchased from pharmacies or vets.

Then:

- ✓ Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible. Pull upwards slowly and firmly, as mouthparts left in the skin can cause a local infection
- ✓ Once removed, apply antiseptic to the bite area and keep an eye on it for several weeks for any changes
- ✓ Contact your GP if you begin to feel unwell or develop a circular red skin rash, often described as a bull's-eye rash, and remember to tell them that you were bitten by a tick. On the Farm— Ben Robinson

Lambing has been very successful owing to the spectacular run of favourable weather through April and May. Losses have been minimal, and ewes have been milking well. Sheep originated from the Middle East and still much prefer a drought than a wet time. The lack of moisture has meant that the parasitic worm burden has stayed low. We monitor the presence of worm eggs by microscope through regular Faecal Egg Counting. This helps prevent the under or overuse of anthelmintic wormers. We have recently weighed the lambs to obtain an 8-week weight, from which we work out the growth rates of the lambs. The best groups, which are grazing new herbal leys, are achieving 330 grams/day.

By contrast the groups on the old permanent pasture are achieving 220 grams/day. Whilst this is still an acceptable growth figure it will mean those lambs on the permanent pasture will stay on farm an extra couple of months compared to those on the leys and therefore will cost more in the long run to achieve the same carcase size.

The month of May was called 'Thrimilce' in Anglo Saxon, as it was the time of year when the cows produced so much milk that they could be milked three times a day. This Spring has been exceptional for many dairy farmers. The milk price is strong, driven by global demand for dairy products. Grazing conditions have been excellent and grain prices have stayed low meaning it has paid well to feed cattle hard to produce more milk.

Every year there is a 'spring flush' with peak milk production occurring around the first week of May. Traditionally this was because milk production rose when cows were turned out to grass, however with better modern rationing there is now less of a bounce. The spring flush is now largely caused by Spring block calving herds who calve the whole herd in February and March, rather than using the traditional all year-round calving model of dairying. This extra volume concentrated in the Spring can cause headaches for milk buyers, and any small hitch at the factory can lead to issues which may cause milk to back up and in the worst-case scenario have to be poured away.

To date UK milk production is 5.9% up on the same period in 2024, a massive increase in a product where demand is normally relatively inelastic. However, due to strong exports and increasing value added markets of cheese and protein packed foods the milk is being well utilised, leading to a healthy milk price for farmers.

Despite reports to the contrary, dairy has a strong future, especially in countries like the UK with a favourable maritime climate.



Summary High pressure dominated for the first week and a half with fine, sunny weather and despite a cool north easterly breeze, above average daytime temperatures on all but one occasion. There was a shift to low pressure on the 12th and frontal systems brought much needed rain in the middle third of the month with the largest fall of 0.39 inches overnight on the 22nd. Settled conditions then returned and temperatures rose on five consecutive days to a maximum of 79°F on the 30th, the last three with unbroken sunshine. Rainfall for the month was just 39% of the long-term average and it was the driest start to spring since 2011. Overall, the temperature for April was above average due to the warm, sunny days. The Met Office reported that it was the sunniest and third warmest April on record in England.

Stanchester 2025 Excavations

Basingstoke Archaeological and Historical Society

Last summer's excavations at the Stanchester Roman site by the Basingstoke Archaeological and Historical Society's excavation investigated the corridor and three rooms of a domestic building.

Two rooms had remnants of coloured wall plaster with one appearing to have had a purple finish, and the other a mix of green and yellow. The corridor plaster samples were of a magnolia shade of white.

One of the significant findings was that the corridor at the front of the building had been constructed on top of a substantial Iron Age enclosure ditch and there was evidence of subsidence and subsequent repair. This year we plan to investigate the remaining parts of the same building, which includes a room that appears to have a sunken surface.

Elsewhere on the site, a trial trench, dug to check the findings of a geophysical survey, revealed part of another structure with a glimpse of a stoke hole. This summer, the trench will be extended to investigate whether this is a corn dryer or something more sophisticated such as the remains of a bath house.

We will be on site for three weeks from 26th July to the 16th of August and would love to welcome you as a volunteer to join our team. We will provide guidance and training and make sure that you have an interesting and enjoyable time. If that sounds too energetic but you would be interested in paying a visit, then we will be holding an open afternoon on Friday 15th August where we give a tour of the site, and you will be able to see an exhibition of finds.

We are pleased to invite you to an early summer gathering on Friday 6 June, taking place on the field beside the Candover Valley Store.


