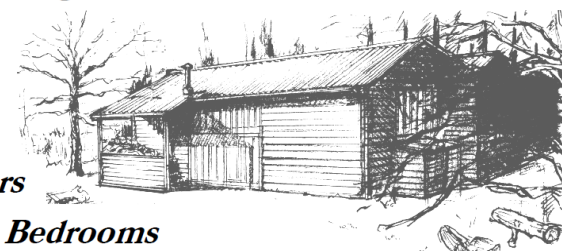

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

The sights and sounds of early summer unfold at quite a pace. Here at Northington Down, I try to capture the moment with a cameo of a swallow, skimming over a field of ripening barley rippling in the morning breeze. Under clear blue skies, I note the field margins, now white with swaying ranks of oxeye or moon daisies, offset by hedgerows of elderflowers whose fragrant umbels are cream white.

Looking along the lane, the hedges stretch away, leafy green, apart from curious twiggy patches draped in silken webbing. Here the leaves have been nibbled away by the hungry caterpillars of the rather elegant but small ermine moth. In the tree world, the huge limes of the Candover valley now stand out, festooned with splendid displays of floral bracts: pale green and oblong.

With fingers crossed, we awaited the seasonal return of the house martins. The challenges of their long hazardous journey to winter in Central Africa, has reduced their numbers year on year. Fortunately, by mid-May a dozen or so were back one evening, swooping around the Flint Barn, across at Newhouse Farm; their characteristic white rumps catching the light of the setting sun.

Over the following days, they were soon nest-building – a charming sight as they each fly down, landing to scoop up a beak full of mud from the farmyard floor where the farm vehicles are washed down. Adept at mud-cup pottery, they soon restore or build afresh their nests under the eaves of this barn, a traditional nest-site, as well as exploring some of the neighbouring cottages.

During this record long dry sunny spell, the lure of shady riverside walks has great appeal. At Winnall Moors nature reserve one morning, warblers were in full song from the reed beds and dense cover of surrounding trees. Of particular interest was the startlingly loud call of Cetti's warbler, an elusive resident, originally Mediterranean, but now well established around the wetlands of the river Itchen. This warbler, pronounced *chetty*, commemorates Francesco Cetti, an 18th century zoologist based in Sardinia.

Cold callers in the Valley

To protect yourselves from cold callers, residents in Basingstoke RG25 and East Hants SO24, should always be alert, never agree to anything on the spot, and avoid engaging with unsolicited callers. Displaying "No Cold Calling" stickers or joining a No Cold Calling Zone can also deter these callers.

Elaboration:

Safety First:

- **Stay alert:** Be cautious when someone approaches your door unexpectedly.
- **Don't open the door:** If you're unsure who's at the door, don't open it without seeing who it is through a spyhole or door chain.
- **Always use your door chain:** This provides an extra layer of security and allows you to assess the situation before fully opening the door.

Never Agree to Anything:

- **Don't agree on the spot:**

Resist pressure to make immediate decisions, especially if the caller is being pushy or using emotional appeals.

- **Get a second opinion:**

If a caller suggests work needs to be done urgently, seek a second opinion from a trusted professional.

- **Don't pay up front:**

Never pay a full amount upfront, and always withhold payment until the work is completed to a satisfactory standard.

Detering Cold Callers:

- **"No Cold Calling" Stickers:**

Displaying a sticker on your door or window can signal that you do not want to be approached by cold callers.

- **No Cold Calling Zones:**

Areas where residents have designated themselves as "No Cold Calling Zones" can deter callers.

- **Reporting Incidents:**

If you feel threatened or if a cold caller is being aggressive, report it to the police (999 if it's an emergency, 101 for non-emergencies) or Trading Standards via the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 0808 223 1133.

Additional Tips:

- **Check ID:**

If a caller claims to be from a legitimate organization, ask for their ID and verify it with the organization's official contact information.

- **Be wary of "special offers":**

Be cautious of claims of special offers or offers that are only available for a limited time, as these are often used by rogue traders.

- **Take your time:**

Don't feel obligated to engage with cold callers at all, or to make a decision immediately.

- **Learn about scams:**

Become aware of common scam tactics to protect yourself and others.

By following these tips, residents can significantly reduce the risk of becoming victims of cold calling and protect themselves and their property.

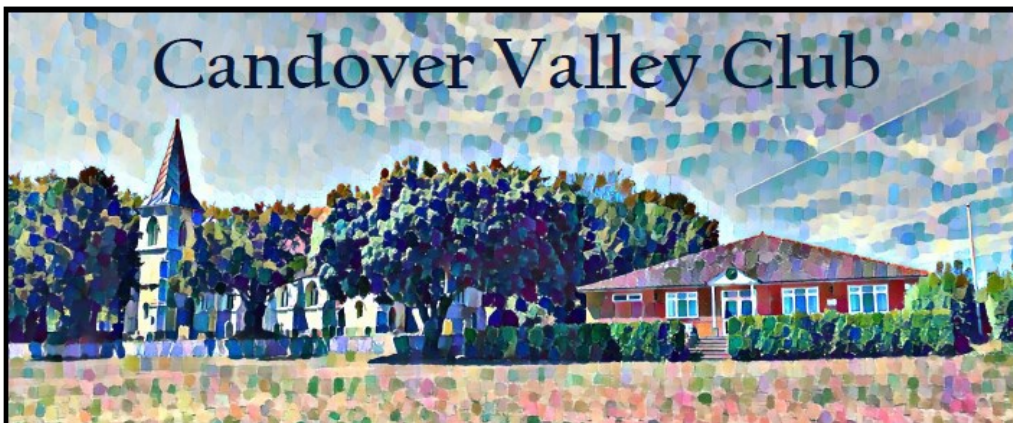

Covid Spring vaccination programme

Over the months of April-June our amazing practice team in addition to our bank practice nurse vaccinated 1100 of our patients who were eligible for their covid spring vaccination.

In addition to this our community nurse team & bank practice nurse vaccinated any eligible, truly housebound patients.

We would like to thank our amazing staff who have carried out this vaccination programme in addition to their usual workload, this includes our tremendous Reception team & Management team who are pivotal in the co ordination of the programme.

We will update patients as soon as we have been updated by NHS England with regards to if/when their will be an autumn booster program.

Travelling abroad

Immunisations and advice are available through our Travel Service.

It is important to make this initial appointment as early as possible - We will be unable to offer travel appointments to anyone travelling with less than **(12 weeks)** prior to their departure date as in some cases a second appointment will be required with the practice nurse to complete a course of vaccinations. Some vaccines have to be ordered as they are not a stock vaccine. Your second appointment needs to be at least 2 weeks before you travel to allow the vaccines to work.

There is still **no guarantee** we will be able to accommodate your travel request as we have limited capacity, even if you do give us a minimum of 12 weeks notice.

On the Farm— Julian Gibbons

Every year the run in to harvest seems to get faster and start date starts to form and you realise you still have lots to do to get ready.

The combine is serviced; ditto the grain drier (hopefully not required); grain stores started to be cleaned. The last load of last harvest's grain is being picked up this week, leaving us small balances to carry over.

Harvest we know isn't going to be great. The wheat harvest might be better than we feared, and the sun will help with grain fill; the barley harvest will not be as good as we had hoped. The dry spring has not helped the spring barley that showed so much promise at planting time. It has failed to develop as many sideshoots (tillers) as it should have done, and it has also shed some as a defence mechanism against the lack of moisture. Our peas look to have coped with the dry weather the best, we just have to hope they remain standing at harvest.

On the bright side we have saved on disease control on all the cereals with either spraying less, using cheaper products or a combination of the 2. Wet weather diseases are our main enemy, and these are the most expensive ones to control.

We went on a farm visit with our trials group we belong to. Apart from his own crops he hosts national variety trials. In the demonstration plots they have unsprayed plots and high input plots that are designed to keep all disease out with what would be an uneconomical spray program, but is designed to show yield potential. In a usual year some of the untreated plots would have no green leaves left after the ravages of leaf diseases. This year the untreated plots looked better and greener. This is because all sprays add stress to the crop, but usually it is cancelled out by the effects of disease.

It will be interesting to see the plot yields when they are finally harvested.

The welcome rain in June has meant we were able to get all our wild bird food crops planted. 3 days later they were already germinating. We have added some sunflowers into some of the strips to add a bit of colour. The strips all include quite diverse mixes to provide a range of seeds throughout the winter. Millet, Sorghum, Triticale, Linseed, Radish, Quinoa, Camelina, Kale feature in most of the mixes.

Thoughts are already turning to next years harvest. Cropping plans have been prepared, fertiliser has been ordered, and varieties are being considered. We will keep some of our own seed to be sown this autumn. We will rogue those crops for wild oats and keep some harvested crop separate, which can then be tested for disease and germination. If it is disease free it gives us the option to not treat it with a seed dressing.

Our Candover Valley Farmers cluster group had a great final meeting of the year at Chilton Manor, where we had good discussions on managing various margins to get the best out of them. This was followed by a wonderful BBQ laid on by Anna and Matt Winter at The Yard with meat from Newhouse Farm.

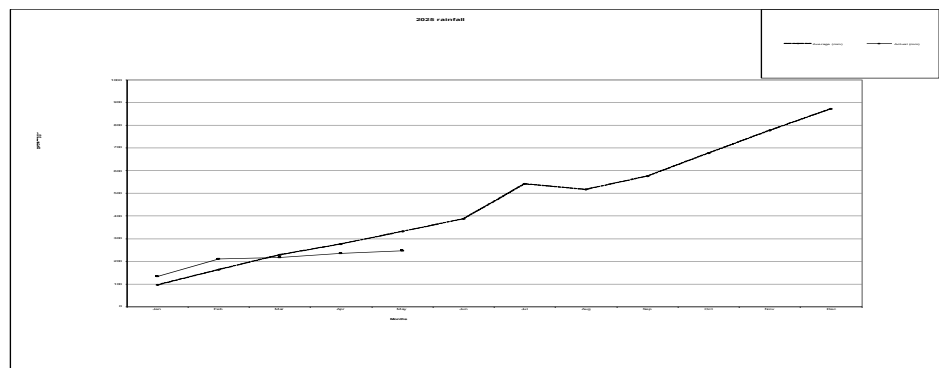

Summary There was a warm and sunny start to the month and at 82°F, the temperature on the 1st was a record for May. Then a cool northerly breeze in the second half of the first week reduced the temperature somewhat, and the only air frost was recorded on the 6th. The first measurable rain for nineteen days fell overnight on the 11th. It was the wettest day on the 13th then high pressure brought settled conditions in the third week with some of the finest and dry weather. It became unsettled from the 21st as frontal systems brought showers and longer outbreaks of rain. The last few days of the month were dry with increasing daytime temperatures. Overall, the month and spring season had above average temperatures. The month was dry, with just 20% of the average rainfall and it was the driest spring recorded here with just 1.40 inches of rain.
