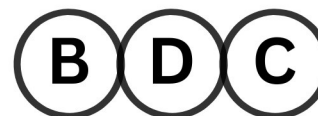

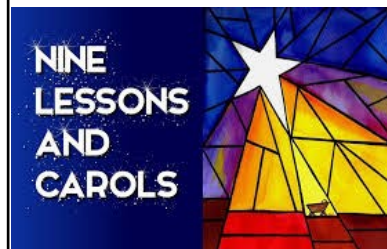
Advent Sunday at St Mary's

We lived in Sumner House in Preston Candover from 1978-2006 with our 4 children, and were joined by Penny's Granny in the early 80s and her mother and stepfather from 1983 till 2006 when her mother died...all three are buried in St Mary's churchyard as is Marina Thorne who was our beloved cleaner for 23 years.

We moved up to London in 2006 but visit the Candover Valley regularly as two of our daughters still live there, and several times a year we go to St Mary's to tend our graves which we enjoy doing.... most of the time!

But now we're both in our 80s we're finding that strimming round them and keeping them tidy is becoming harder and a real chore (especially when holding a walking stick!) which we don't look forward to at all! As all our graves aren't in the front rows surrounded by neatly mown grass but further back 'in the rough' where the grass, when we were down in July, was waist high. We are terrified of falling down and ending up in our own graves prematurely!

So, when we turned up on Monday 6th October two weeks ago, with sinking hearts at the thought of the backbreaking work which lay ahead, you can imagine our joy when we found the whole of the rough area had recently been strimmed and tidied and was looking wonderful!

We have no idea who did it but whoever it was is an unsung hero and we would be so grateful if you could pass on our HUGE thanks to him (or her!) via the Oxdrove. Tim and Penny Cooper.

PS. We hope and pray it wasn't a one-off! But do realise that obviously that part of the churchyard isn't as important as the main area which is always beautifully mown whenever we visit St Mary's.

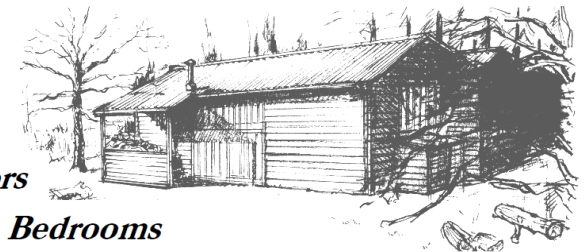

Pete had started his career as a Red Coat at a very young age, and he spoke clearly without a microphone which indicated his advancement to stage director. The theatre is currently owned by Andrew Lloyd Webber who has spent approximately £60M of his own money refurbishing the building. He was warmly thanked for such an interesting and entertaining talk.

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

Following on from last month's article, the dormouse footprint survey proved to be most intriguing. At first on regular visits to refresh the ink pads, there were no signs of activity in any of the twenty tunnels – apart from some inky dribbles of rainwater on the paper linings.

Eventually after four weeks, we were delighted to find the first signs of dormouse footprints in four of the tunnels. By the end of the survey period, we had found sets of prints running through eleven of the tunnels, with some splendid trails of particularly inky footprints. As well, a dormouse had made a summer nest of dried grasses in one of the tunnel tubes.

The use of the footprint tunnels has confirmed the presence of dormice in this mature hedgerow here at Northington Down and seems to be an excellent method to detect these elusive creatures. Even in the summer, dormice are rarely seen, being active usually after dark, foraging through the dense cover of mixed woodland. They make very few sounds, apart from snoring when asleep (see: YouTube Snoring Dormouse).

Flickering movements from the canopy above revealed the shadowy forms of small birds, dipping and twitching as they chased insects. These were leaf warblers on their Michaelmas migration, heading south, although some will stay in milder winters. Their 'chiff' call indicates chiffchaffs on the move. After a dry summer with few puddles, I find they are keen to visit shallow bird baths set up in our garden. As they hop in and splash about, their plumage is olive-brown above, with a tinge of yellow below. They have a pale eye stripe and dark legs. A quick shake and they're away, vanishing into the trees.

Just before storm Amy swept through on 3rd October, we were searching for fungi in Micheldever Woods. In the half-light of the beechwood, we found a dying beech decorated with a fine display of translucent, glistening, egg-white domes. Known as the porcelain mushroom (*Oudemansiella mucida*), this impressive fungus wound its way up the trunk and into the branches, like a natural artwork.

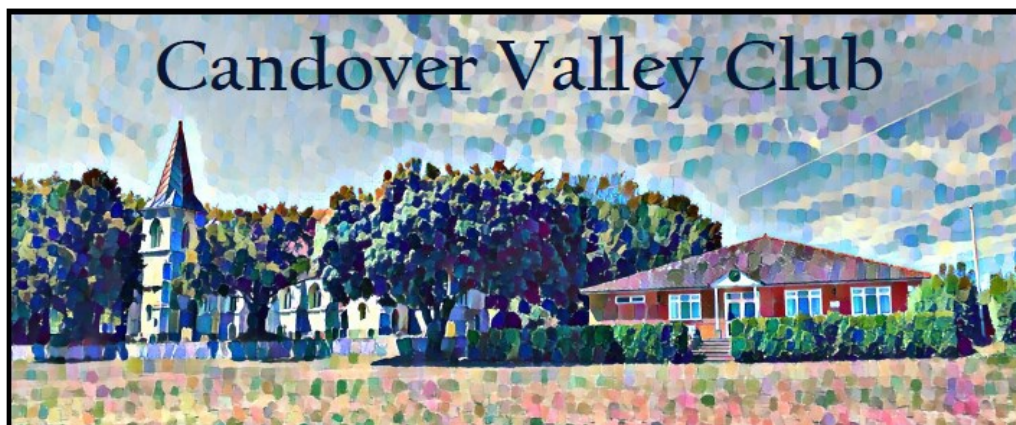

Significant changes to the eligibility criteria for Covid Vaccinations this Autumn 2025/26

For the first time since December 2020, when Covid vaccines were first introduced, people under 75 and those with most clinical risk factors, such as diabetes or heart disease, will no longer be eligible for an NHS Covid booster vaccination. In addition, frontline health and social care workers are no longer eligible for a booster dose. This is in accordance with the latest JCVI guidance, which can be found in Chapter 14a of the Green Book.

This change will affect some 250,000 people across Hampshire and Isle of Wight who until now have been eligible to have an annual NHS Covid booster vaccination each Autumn.

New Eligibility Criteria for Covid Seasonal Vaccine

Residents in a care home for older adults (all residents regardless of age)
All adults aged 75 years and over (including those due to turn 75 years of age on or before 31 January 2026)
Persons aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed, as defined in the specific 'Immunosuppression' subsection of tables 3 and 4 only of the COVID-19 chapter of the Green Book.

Flu vaccination eligible cohorts from 1 October 2025:

those aged 65 years and over
those aged 18 years to under 65 years in clinical risk groups
those in long-stay residential care homes
carers in receipt of carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
close contacts of immunocompromised individuals
frontline health and social care workers

Summary It was with some relief that the dry weather over the past six months came to an end with the onset of autumn. The month was predominantly unsettled, with frontal systems bringing rain for much of the first three weeks. This included frequent showers, some moderate in intensity, in the first week and a half. It was breezy at times, including a fresh breeze with showers on the 15th and the long-term average monthly rainfall had been exceeded three days previously. High pressure brought the best of the weather and settled conditions over five days from the 21st, which included the autumn equinox. There was plenty of sunshine during this time but below average temperatures and the first frost of the season on the 23rd. Overall, September was cool, bringing an end to the six-month run of warmer than average temperatures, and wet with 128% of the long-term average rainfall.

Jackie's County Corner

I saw this quote from Robert Gardner:
*'Because concrete can buy time.
But only Nature can buy tomorrow.'*

It is said that politicians love a hard hat picture. But the truth is that hard hat and safety glasses are not very flattering!

I was visiting a food waste processing site. You can't smell the rotting food in that pile of bags behind me! The people who work at sites like these have my complete respect. It isn't an easy environment to work in, but their value to us is immeasurable.



Managing our waste is an essential part of your Council services. Curiously at present, your district council collects your waste and recycling, and the County Council disposes of it. Each authority includes the cost of their service in the council tax you pay. These arrangements will change when the County Council ceases to exist, and unitary authorities have responsibility for both functions. I'll let you know when the Government consultation on the Unitary options opens

Many other services cross both councils. As we near local government reorganisation, the first reorganisation for fifty years, all councils in Hampshire need to work together for a seamless transition for the sake of our residents. As one of the 'double hatters' representing you on both councils, I feel uniquely placed to understand both worlds and the subsequent challenges the unitary authorities will face. And there are many well publicised challenges. HCC is about to send out another consultation on school transport. If you pay for a 'spare capacity' space, these are at risk of being axed.

At HCC, we regularly look at the Autism services for children. I have taken an especial interest in this and sought a regular update from the NHS to Children's Services as the numbers of children awaiting 'diagnosis' continues to exceed the number receiving them. Their report came to Children's Select committee in October. Today we recognise that no two people with autism experience life in the same way. We don't know why numbers seeking diagnosis are increasing, but it is recognised that improving outcomes for our autistic population and their families and schools requires a whole system approach and cannot be delivered by any organisation in isolation. I have been campaigning for better teacher training for this too. I'm pleased that this is now gaining traction. Over time, there has been a paradigm shift in approach, but there's still more to do. The NHS offers help for parents of children at a drop in on the first Wednesday of every month at the ARC, Winchester. Contact me or CAMHS if you'd like to know more.

Good news! A last-minute change of heart has restored the County Councillor grants scheme. There are tighter rules: total grant pot is £5K, each grant maximum is £1000, and it cannot support ongoing costs, deadline 25th February for submission. Any charity which serves residents in the Itchen Valley division is open to apply search County Councillor Grant on hants.gov.uk

On the Farm— Julian Gibbons

What a difference a year makes. Last autumn we had had a sodden harvest followed by a very wet autumn. Sown crops were being eaten by a biblical plague of slugs. This year we have had just enough rain to soften the ground, the dry weather over the summer has naturally cracked and opened the clay ground.

Our rape has established well, and all the winter cereals are in the ground, with the last sown still to emerge. We have planted the biggest area of winter wheat for many years; all we have to do is control costs on the crop to try and make a profit. It isn't all sunshine and roses; there is always something that rears its head. This year it is a little fly called gout fly. It isn't new and we used to get wheat affected by it when we planted crops in the middle of September. It lays its eggs on the newly emerged leaves, 7-10 days later the eggs hatch and the larvae burrow into the shoot. In the spring, the affected shoots are short and swollen like small leeks and they eventually die off. Hopefully the plant produces enough extra shoots to compensate for the loss of the main shoot, and it generally does. The early emerged crops were covered in the little white, cylindrical eggs so we will have to wait until the spring to see the crop effect.

Because we have struggled to plant crops in the wet conditions of the past two autumns we bought a second-hand seed-drill that will plant in more challenging conditions, and we did use it a bit following a pea crop that had a lot of trash. We will use it to plant our winter beans that are still to be planted (currently a bit early at mid-October).

We have planted our various pollen and nectar strips that needed to go in this autumn to replace the ones that failed to establish last year. We have paid a bit more for a better mix that will hopefully last a few more years, before being replaced. We did finally get our combine out of the field from where it had resided since it caught fire. We were waiting for some parts to come from the USA, but they eventually arrived, and the combine was able to be driven out of the field. It leaves a combine shaped patch in the rapeseed that has been planted around it.

When I use to drive through Wales to see our daughter in Aberystwyth, there were signs to stop and see Red Kites. I would see one flying if you were lucky. Back in Hampshire they are everywhere. One day I had 21 Red Kites in the field where I was planting. They are after voles and mice. I did however see a Buzzard trying to fly off with a leveret, that was probably just a bit too heavy for it. Auto steer enables you to be much more observant whilst tractor driving.

A report issued on the vulnerabilities of various jobs to AI, did reveal that if you are a translator (one of the most vulnerable jobs), you should consider retraining as a tractor driver (the least vulnerable job). So, there is one silver lining for the future, we just have to get there!
